THE CRAFT OF PSYCHOTHERAPY: HONING YOUR SKILLS IN CONDUCTING THE "50 MINUTE HOUR"

Do you ever marvel at what it takes to create truly effective clinical/therapeutic hours?

A therapist's challenge is to translate clinical theory into highly intentional, professional level encounters that create the opportunity for growth within the relational dyad of therapist and client.

Across numerous schools of thought, fundamental skills form the basis of therapeutic interventions.

But, how do we hone these practice skills long after our graduate school days?

Next fall, I will offer a 6 session workshop entirely devoted to strengthening the practice skills we rely on every day.

Through demonstration, simulated client-therapist role plays, small group exercises, and group discussion, participants will explore and expand the following capacities:

- to listen below the surface recognizing multiple facets of truly hearing a client
- to determine when to lead and when to follow the multiple choice points in therapeutic conversation
- to both support and constructively challenge client defenses
- to intentionally choose open and closed ended questioning
- to select among specific response options in times of client silences
- to effectively "hold" client (and therapist) emotions
- to further develop our constructive "uses of self"

INTENDED PARTICIPANTS

While classroom exercises can be adapted for therapists with varying experience levels, practitioners with several years of postgraduate work may especially benefit from this shared experience with colleagues.
