Description:

All Council on Social Work Education programs measure and report student learning outcomes. Students are assessed on their mastery of the competencies that comprise the accreditation standards of the Council on Social Work Education. These competencies are dimensions of social work practice that all social workers are expected to master during their professional training. A measurement benchmark is set by the social work programs for each competency. An assessment score at or above that benchmark is considered by the program to represent mastery of that particular competency.

¹Competencies are measure by assessing each student's performance on the practice behaviors associated with each competency at completion of the final filed practicum. The assessment includes a self assessment and an assessment by the field supervisor. The assessment scale is a 0-6 scale where 0=unprepared, 3=appropriately prepared for entry level practice, and 6=outstanding preparation. Mastery of each competency is assessed by averaging the student plus the supervisor assessments across all practice behaviors for the competency. The average is compared to the standard of a 3 on this scale (appropriately prepared for entry level practice). The benchmark is set at 90% of graduates will be at this standard of appropriately prepared (or better) for entry level practice.
